

BAC Photographic Guidelines for Parents and Spectators

- Parents and spectators taking photographs and videos of children should only use them for the purpose of recording their own child and or family members.
- Photographers should not take photos of other children without the express permission of that child's parents/carers
- Images should present the activity in a positive light, and promote the best aspects of the sport
- Images of children should be in suitable dress or kit
- Avoid images and camera angles that might be prone to misinterpretation or misuse by others
- Parents and spectators should take care as to how photos and videos may be shared on social media as there are risks attached e.g. do not supply full name and address
- **Photography and video recording is banned totally in the toilets and shower/changing areas**

If anyone has concerns about the behaviour of any other person in this context they should bring it to the attention of the Welfare Officers or any committee member if a Welfare Officer is unobtainable. Club officials are usually in the office and names of all club officers can be found on the club website <http://www.bournemouthac.co.uk/community/about-the-club/>

If the concern is raised during a league match or other competition report your concern to the Meeting Manager – any track or field official should be able to tell you who is acting on that role – then advise a Welfare Officer later.

If anyone is suspected of taking images of children (or adults) in a state of undress, the Welfare Officer should be informed immediately and the police consulted.
